Following the conclusion of the SCCC's 59th Council Elections on 11 January 2017, we are pleased to announce that Roland Ng San Tiong has been elected as President of the SCCC's 59<sup>th</sup> Council. He will be heading the Chamber for the next two years.

Roland Ng said: "I am thankful for the trust given by the Council to be elected as Chamber's President. The core team of the 59<sup>th</sup> Council is very strong. We have three Vice-Presidents from very different backgrounds. The nine new Council Members represent very diverse industries, ranging from media, retail, investments, infocommunications, building and construction, marine, and healthcare. They are both aged 44, and the youngest among the nine new Council Members.
